Camping Lot & Bastides

Lot et Bastides Campsite Rules

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1.1. Entry conditions:

To be granted entry, to settle in and stay on the Lot et Bastides campsite, you must have received permission by the manager or his representative.

The Lot et Bastides campsite is a tourist camp which has the exclusive purpose of welcoming campers for leisure reasons on a temporary basis in accommodation of either a tent, a caravan or a motor home. Anyone intending to stay on a permanent or long-term basis will be refused entry.

Any form of religious or political proselytising is forbidden.

Except for those authorised by the Manager, every act of trade or commercial advertising is prohibited.

Commercial vehicles are prohibited, except for vehicles required to operate the site.

Staying on the campsite implies acceptance of these rules and the commitment to comply.

1.2. Police formalities:

Any person who stays at least one night on the campsite has to produce their identity papers to the manager or their representative and carry out the police formalities.

Minors unaccompanied by their parents will only be accepted upon presentation of written authorisation from the parents.

1.3. Setting up:

Tents, caravans or recreational vehicles and their equipment should be installed on the indicated pitch in accordance with the directives given by the manager or his representative.

1.4. Reception office:

Open from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., and 3 to 8 p.m

The Reception provides all useful information regarding campsite facilities, possibilities of fresh supplies, sport facilities, interesting local sights and other useful addresses.

A complaints book is at the disposal of the campers. Complaints will only be taken into consideration if they are signed, dated, as detailed as possible and relate to quite recent events.

1.5. Fees:

Fees are to be paid at the reception. These fees are displayed at the campsite entrance and at the Reception.

These fees relate to the number of nights spent on the campsite and must be paid the day before departure.

1.6. Noise and silence:

Campers are requested to avoid any noise and talking which may disturb their neighbours and to moderate the volume of radios and other acoustic appliances. Please close your doors and car boots gently.

Dogs and other animals are only allowed if kept on a leash, and are the sole responsibility of their owners. They must never be left alone on the campsite, even if locked in.

Complete silence must be respected between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.

1.7. Visitors:

After authorisation by the manager or his representative, visitors will be allowed to enter the campsite at the campers' responsibility.

If these visitors are allowed to enter the campsite, the camper receiving them may be required to pay a fee insofar as the visitor has access to the campsites' services and/or facilities, except for the swimming pool. These fees are displayed at the campsite entrance and at the reception office.

Visitors' cars are not allowed on the campsite.

1.8. Traffic and parking:

Within the campsite, speed is limited to 10 km/h.

No traffic is allowed between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. The automatic barriers operate using a badge that you will receive from the reception upon registration. A deposit is required for this.

Only campers staying on the campsite can drive into the camping area. Parking should not impede the movement or the settling of newcomers.

1.9. Maintenance and appearance of the campsite's facilities:

Everyone is required to respect and help maintain the cleanliness and hygiene of the campsite and to avoid any action which compromises the campsite's hygiene, appearance and services, particularly the sanitary facilities.

Do not throw dirty water on the ground or in the gutters.

Please put household waste, scraps of any kind and paper in the designated bins. No washing is permitted outside the designated sinks.

Hanging out washing should no bother your neighbours, and attaching washing lines to trees is not allowed.

Plants and flowers must be respected.

It is forbidden to nail anything to trees, cut branches or plant anything.

Using personal means to mark out boundaries or dig the ground is also forbidden.

You will be responsible for any damage to vegetation, fences, land or facilities.

The pitch should be left in exactly the same condition as you found it, upon arrival.

1.10. Safety:

a) Fire:

Open fires (wood, coal etc.) are strictly forbidden. Cooking equipment must be in excellent condition and not be used in hazardous conditions. **Barbecues are only allowed in the designated areas.**

In case of fire, inform the campsite manager immediately. Fire extinguishers are at everyone's disposal.

A first-aid kit is available at the Reception.

b) Theft:

Management is not responsible for any camping or caravanning material brought into the campsite. Campers remain responsible for their own site and must inform the manager of any suspicious presence.

Though the campsite is under surveillance, campers are required to take care of their own belongings.

1.11. Games:

No violent or noisy games are allowed near the campsite facilities.

The snack bar room cannot be used for physical games.

Parents should always supervise their children.

1.12. UNOCCUPIED TENTS OR CARAVANS:

Unoccupied tents or caravans may be left on the campsite only with the approval of the Campsite manager and on the specified pitch. A fee will be charged for caravans or tents left on the Campsite.

1.13. INFORMATION:

These rules and regulations are displayed at the Campsite entrance and at the Reception. They can be supplied to any customer on request.

1.14. Infringement of rules:

Should a camper disturb the stay of any other camper or fail to honour these rules and regulations, the manager or his representative will give formal notice to stop this behaviour.

Continued serious or repeated infringement of these rules and regulations following a formal request to conform to them may lead to the expulsion of the offender.

In case of unlawful actions, the manager may call the Police.

2. SPECIFIC CONDITIONS

SWIMMING POOL RULES

Use of the swimming pool is strictly reserved for residents and they must comply with all hygiene and safety rules. Visitors are not allowed to use the pool.

Users must wear the bracelet provided by the reception.

Minors use the pool under the responsibility of their parents or a responsible adult who shall be the sole supervisor.

Before entering the pool, swimmers must take a shower and foot bath.

The following are strictly forbidden in the pool area:

- Animals
- Shoes
- Lilos, flippers and snorkels
- Electric devices
- Underwear, shorts and any unsuitable clothes for swimming.
- Monokinis

Wearing a bathing suit is compulsory for all. Some swimming shorts may be allowed if they are worn exclusively for swimming.

- The following is also prohibited in the pool:
- Smoking and eating
- Spitting or spitting out chewing-gum
- Running on the poolside and diving
- Entering if you have any cuts, bandages or contagious diseases.
